Canadian National Day of Remembrance and Action On Violence Against Women December 6th

On Dec. 6, 1989, the country of Canada was forever changed. Fourteen women died at Montreal's École Polytechnique, killed simply because they were women by a man who stated that he hated feminists. They were brilliant students, creative thinkers, beloved sisters, cherished daughters. Their lives, cut short, became the source of sorrow for a nation.

Their deaths sparked a movement that took direct aim at violence hidden in the shadows for too long. To read the stories of the 14 women, 13 students and one university employee, who lost their lives visit this link.

The murderer left behind a list of other women in Quebec that he intended to kill. One of them was Francine Pelletier, a writer and director, who created a film called Legacy of Pain on the 10 th Anniversary of that tragic day. You can watch the 42 minute film on the website above.

These words taken from the Canadian website ring just as true here in the United States. "As we mourn their loss and remember their lives, we reaffirm our commitment to fight the hatred that led to this tragedy, and the misogyny that still exists today. In Canada and around the world, women, girls and 2SLGBTQI+ individuals face unacceptable violence and discrimination. Gender-based violence in Canada has been magnified and amplified by the COVID-19 pandemic. There have been reports from police services, shelters, and local organization of an increase in calls related to gender-based violence across Canada during the pandemic."

The National Day of Remembrance and Action on Violence Against Women is about remembering those who have experienced gender-based violence and those who we have lost to it. It is also a time to take action. The Day is referred to as White Ribbon Day and Canadians will be wearing white ribbons. If you see one, share a Soroptimist hug.


