During our Golden West Region Spring Conference, our delegates, Diane & Becky, learned about a General Education Development (GED) Club Program which we will be considering for our next Club year. The GED Club Program Workshop addressed how clubs can assist women and girls through GED assistance.

This Program would supplement our Dream Programs as a Big Goal Accelerator Project and could be structured to provide vouchers to cover the expense of final testing on one or all the subjects needed to obtain the GED including Math, Science, Social Studies, Reading and Language Arts or other financial assistance.

Next steps will be to outline SIPD Program specifics including eligibility & types of assistance to be provided and how outreach would be conducted.
