

## March 1 - March 31

Throughout the month of March, we celebrate the contributions of women from the past and present. While it's important to celebrate women all year long, Congress sets aside one month each year to recognize the accomplishments made by women, for women, and to make our country and world, a fairer, safer place for all.

In 1980, President Jimmy Carter issued the first Presidential Proclamation that declared the week of March 8th to be National Women's History Week. In 1987 Congress designated March as Women's History Month.

Women's History Month started as Women's Day, which was celebrated on Feb. 28, 1909, by a group of Manhattan socialists and suffragists to honor the one-year anniversary of the garment strike which was led by the International Ladies' Garment Workers' Union. The observance took place on a Sunday so that people would not miss work.

The value of knowing women's stories is that it gives both women and men, girls and boys the power and inspiration to succeed. It enables us to understand our past, and gives us the power to change the future.

As society sees what women can do, as women see what women can do, there will be more women out there doing things, and we'll all be better off for it."

Soroptimist House of Hope Supporters,

We are thrilled to invite you to mark your calendars for our upcoming luncheon!

We understand that scheduling conflicts may arise, but there are still impactful ways to support Soroptimist House of Hope (SHOH) in achieving our ambitious goal of raising \$250,000.

SHOH has applied for the Behavioral Health Continuum Infrastructure Program (BHCIP) grant, and while we won't know if we have secured the grant until June 2025, we have stepped out in faith and secured a property at 22900 Curtin Road. This bold move will increase our chances of being selected for the grant, as it shows our commitment to expanding services for women in need.

#### Our vision includes:

Transforming our existing property into a 6-bed detox facility and Developing a 14-bed women's residential treatment program at the new location.

The BHCIP grant requires a 10% match, and we hope to avoid pulling equity from our current property. That is where your generosity makes all the difference. Whether through sponsorship, donations, or event participation, your support will help us reach this critical milestone.

If the BHCIP grant is not secured, the funds raised will directly support renovations at the new ADA-compliant, licensed, and conditionally permitted property. Should we receive the grant, your contributions will go towards the 10% match required.

We've also attached a flyer showcasing the new property to provide a glimpse of what your support can help us accomplish.

Thank you for standing with us as we expand our mission of empowering women and rebuilding lives. We are profoundly grateful for your continued generosity and belief in our work.
