International Day of the Girl

On October 11, 2024 our club, launched a "Career Coloring Contest" at Westside Elementary School, in honor of 2024 International Day of the Girl. This year's theme is 'Girls' vision for the future', and conveys both the need for urgent action and persistent hope, driven by the power of girls' voices and vision for the future.

The International Day of the Girl Child was declared by the United Nations; and, it is also called the Day of Girls and the International Day of the Girl.

October 11, 2012, was the first Day of the Girl Child. This observance is in support of opportunity for girls and increases the awareness of gender inequality faced by girls worldwide in areas such as: access to education, nutrition, legal rights, medical care, and protection from discrimination, violence against women and forced child marriage.

The Midnight Ride of Sybil Ludington

Sybil Ludington is known as the "female Paul Revere" and although her actions were just as heroic, she was largely forgotten until just over a century after her own midnight ride took place.

Sybil Ludington was the first of twelve children to Henry and Abigail Ludington. Her father, Colonel Henry Ludington, had served in the British military for more than 60 years but during the American Revolution he had switched sides to the Patriot cause. When the Revolutionary War began, Sybil's father was a commander in the local county militia. Sybil's father was a gristmill owner and the family's farm was in an area between Connecticut and the coast of the Long Island Sound, a region that was particularly susceptible to attack from British troops.

It was shortly after Sybil's 16th birthday, when a rider arrived at her home to tell her father the town of Danbury, Connecticut had been attacked and burned by the British militia. The British sought to capture the arms and ammunition stockpiled in the town. Upon receiving this news, Colonel Ludington knew that he needed to gather his men to go and defend the nearby towns and homes against the advancing British armies. However, the Colonel's men had disbanded for the season and were scattered all around the region in their own farms and homesteads.



Sybil got on her horse and road all through the night alerting the Colonel's men of the attack. Sybil's ride was not easy as she rode through the dark, in the woods and through the rain. She is said to have ridden around forty miles, which is almost triple the length of Paul Revere's famous ride, just to make sure that all were alerted of the British menace.

Not only did Sybil face the precarious weather and terrain, she also risked attack or capture at the hands of the British. However, Sybil knew the land around her family's farm well and she knew where her father's men lived —

information which served her well. By the time Sybil made it back home by daybreak, many of the men had gathered and were ready to march. Although Colonel Ludington's troops arrived too late to aid the defense of Danbury, they did confront the departing British and drove them back to Long Island Sound.

Sybil's heroic efforts were greatly appreciated by her friends, neighbors, and even George Washington is reported to have personally delivered his thanks to the young teenager.

A Note From Patsy Bauman

I have been abundantly fortunate to have had my various teaching endeavors supported by the generous women of SIPD over the past few years. For those of you who have been on this journey with me, you know that my little people face many struggles.



All teachers, depending upon where they teach and the community in which they serve, encounters unique sets of challenges and obstacles. One common hindrance is the occurrence of head lice. All of my little girls have long thick hair that can easily hide these small beasts.

Also, kindergarten students play together like puppies, readily spreading the bugs and eggs. You can imagine, it is very difficult to concentrate with critters crawling on your scalp! I won't go into protocol

or details of the family circumstances, but I will say that in many cases, lice don't disappear after one treatment. Treatments must be thoroughly performed on every family member multiple times.

This can be costly and geographically prohibitive. Your donation of 5 bottles of Rid medicine will help to remove one more obstacle prohibiting my little girls from becoming educated young women.

I am proud to be part of a group that supports and believes in all girls, no matter their challenges.




